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Foreword

As Project PRECISION celebrates its first anniversary, I am deeply grateful for the journey my team and I have shared. What began as a vision – to help protect children in Spain from sexual cyber-violence – has grown into a committed, international community to help make children everywhere be and feel safer online.

Following a set-up period at the end of 2024, during which we secured all the required ethical approvals and established agile management structures and working practices, 2025 has been all about laying strong foundations. We have conducted pioneer research into the language practices that enable sexual cyber-violence against children (SC-VAC): grooming, online sexual harmful exchanges between children, deepfake nudes and so forth. We have launched surveys that amplify the voices of educators and young people, as well as mainstream the perspectives of survivors. We have shared our findings at global conferences, engaged with civil society and built an Advisory Network that spans continents. These achievements reflect not only our commitment to academic excellence but also our strong belief in collaboration across borders and disciplines.

Advocacy has been at the heart of our work. Through media engagement, public events and partnerships with leading NGOs and policymakers, we have raised awareness of the urgent need to address SC-VAC. Every conversation, every workshop, every keynote has reinforced our belief that meaningful change happens when research meets practice and diverse voices come together.

As we move into our second year, we look forward to co-creating the PRECISION Toolkit with educators, child protection professionals, families, and young people. This next phase is about turning insights into action – developing ethically and empirically grounded resources that make a real difference in child safeguarding.

To all who have contributed -thank you. Your expertise, trust, commitment and passion inspire us every day to build a future where digital technology protects our children.

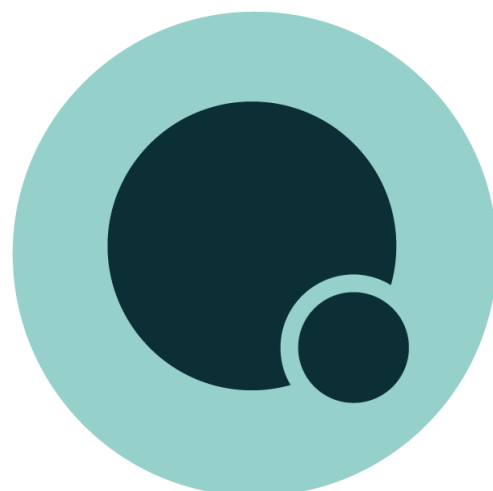

Welcome

Against a backdrop of rising sexual cyber-violence against children (SC-VAC), PRECISION's primary aim is to develop, evaluate and disseminate pioneer training and prevention resources to counter SC-VAC: the PRECISION Toolkit.

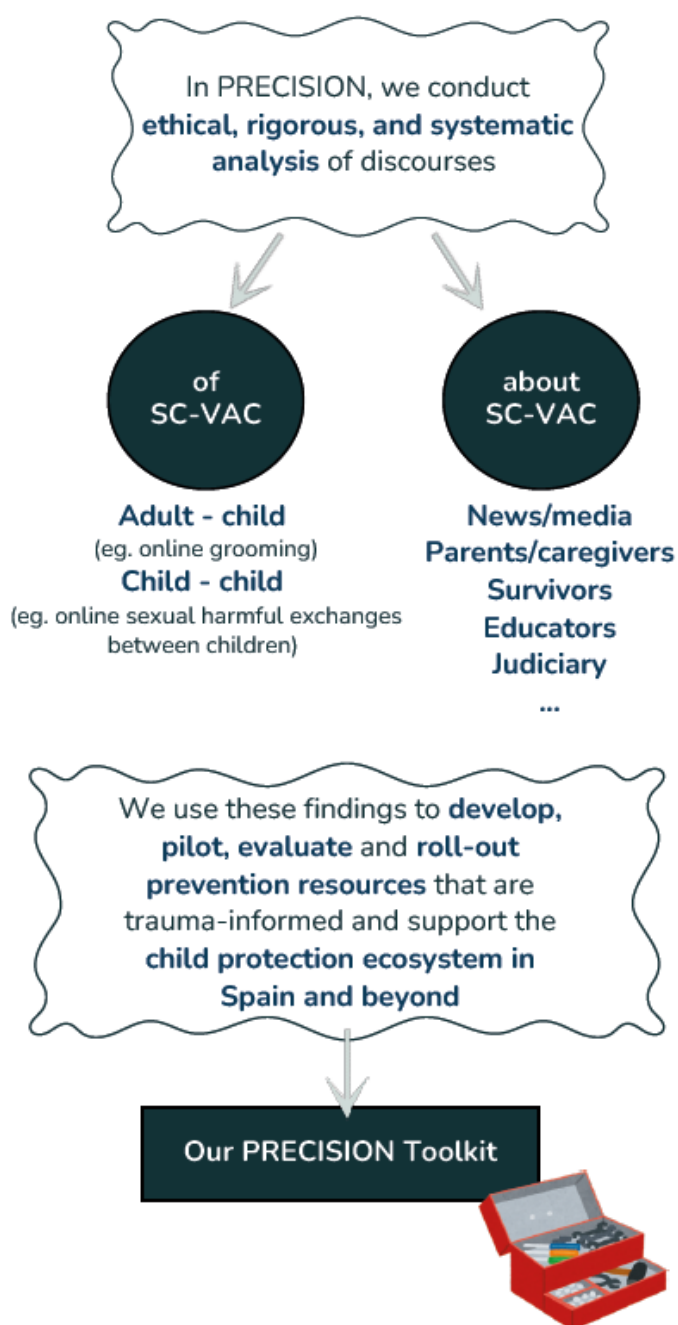


Figure 1. PRECISION approach

What sets our approach apart? We co-develop resources with end-users and ground them in ethical, rigorous, and systematic analysis of **communication** in contexts of SC-VAC, and the voices of key stakeholders (media, educators, families, young people, and survivors), see Figure 1.

PRECISION Toolkit: pioneering prevention resources to counter SC-VAC

PRECISION Timeline at a Glimpse

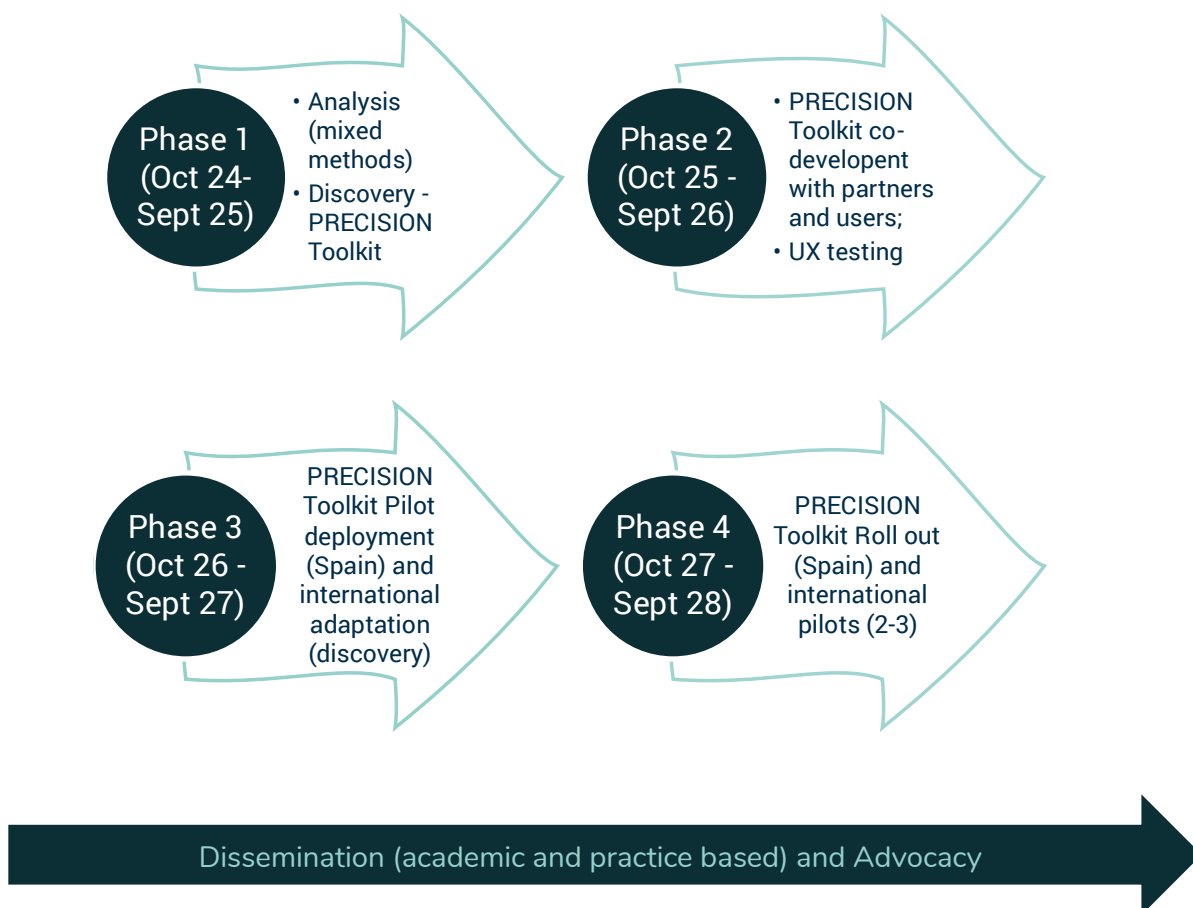


Figure 2. PRECISION Timeline

PRECISION is a four-year project, with tasks divided into four distinct phases, as shown in Figure 2:

A Spotlight on Phase 1

The first phase of the project (2024-2025) involved interdisciplinary work to achieve two overarching objectives:

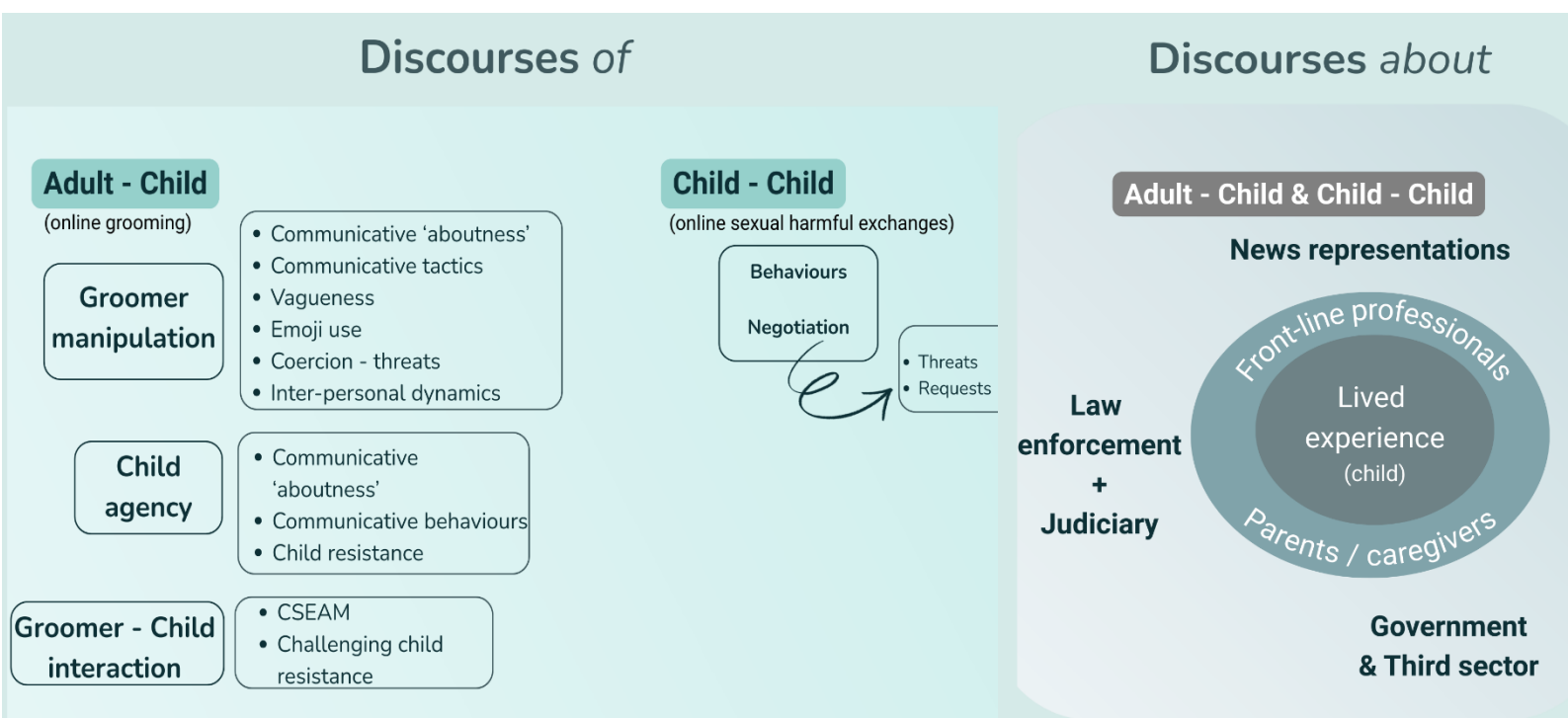


Figure 3. PRECISION Phase 1 - Scope

1. **Conducting an in-depth analysis of discourses of (authentic, digital interactions between adults-children and children-children) and discourses about (judiciary texts, third sector reports, news media articles) SC-VAC, incorporating also the perspectives of survivors.** This analysis draws on linguistic methodologies complemented by online surveys and examines key aspects of the actual language practices involved in SC-VAC (discourses of – See Figure 3) and how different stakeholders in the child protection ecosystem in Spain communicative represent SC-VAC (discourses about – See Figure 3).

2. **Undertaking a preliminary assessment of the training and capacity-building requirements of child protection professionals in Spain.** This endeavour has been carried out in close collaboration with national and international experts from academia, child protection, and education, while also integrating the viewpoints of young people. We organised a specialist workshop to explore with said experts and young people how our research findings about the discourses of and about SC-VAC may be best applied to the design of the **PRECISION Toolkit**. The feedback received on the actual research was highly positive and the insights gathered during the workshop are invaluable, representing the first step towards the co-creation of prevention materials during the second year of the project.



Key objectives accomplished during this first year of PRECISION include:

Securing ethical approval for our research

Designing and piloting three inter-related online surveys, aimed at young people, parents and educators, about their views on SC-VAC, with a focus on the use of so-called deepfake nudes

Distributing the online survey to over 200 educators and c. 100 young people. The survey for parents is scheduled for distribution in 2026

Completing the analysis of all the studies regarding the 'discourses of' SC-VAC

Conducting, in collaboration with the NGO Protect Children Finland, an analysis of survivor survey data

Disseminating our research in academic fora: presenting at 7 conferences, including two keynote addresses at international events organised by the Council of Europe and INHOPE

Completing two international placements, at the CyberThreats Research Centre (Swansea University, UK) and Protect Children Finland (Helsinki, Finland)

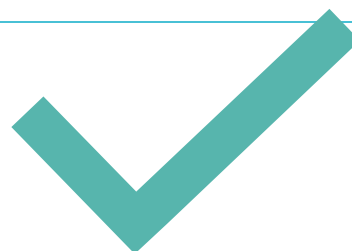
Raising awareness and conducting advocacy for keeping children safe online through engagement in public events and media appearances

Organising the first PRECISION event, involving participation from academia, government, third sector and early career researchers

Mapping the Spanish child protection ecosystem, with a focus on recent (post 2024) policies and key stakeholders

Planning work for Phase 2, with a focus on workshops for co-creating the PRECISION toolkit with educators, parents and young people

Dissemination (selection)



Prof. Nuria Lorenzo-Dus took part in the event “[España ATRAE: un mejor país para la ciencia](#)”, held at the Residencia de Estudiantes in Madrid. The event, including a keynote

address by the Spanish Minister for Science, Innovation and Universities, Ms Diana Morant, brought together 40 of the 58 internationally renowned researchers that the Spanish Ministry of Science, Innovation and Universities has funded since 2023 to work in Spain through the ATRAE programme.



As part of our academic engagement efforts, members of the PRECISION team attended the [Approaches to Digital Discourse Analysis 5](#) conference at Tilburg University (Tilburg, the Netherlands).



In a conference focused on the rise of ChatGPT and other AI models, we shared our research with fellow experts on the link between manipulation-emotion-and graphicon (e.g., emojis, emoticons) use in online grooming discourse.

We also participated in the [5th ILLA Focus Conference on Forensic Linguistics](#) at Vytautas Magnus University (Kaunas, Lithuania).

During this event, which brought together international experts in linguistics and law, we presented key findings of our research into requests for child sexual exploitation and abuse material (CSEAM) within SC-VAC.



INHOPE held its [annual summit](#) in October in Washington DC (USA) and Prof. Nuria Lorenzo-Dus was invited as plenary speaker.



Her talk “An interactional approach to understanding CSEAM” reframed how detection and prevention of CSEAM should be approached. She highlighted that CSEAM is not merely content to be detected and removed, but often the result of deliberate linguistic manipulation and systematic abuse. Understanding the

communicative context in which such material is solicited and discussed is crucial for tackling this heinous crime.

We also presented our work at the [Child Sexual Abuse Reduction Research Network Conference](#), held at the Universitat de València (València, Spain).

Our contribution focused on the development of a hybrid linguistics – AI informed algorithm for the detection of language-specific grooming patterns.

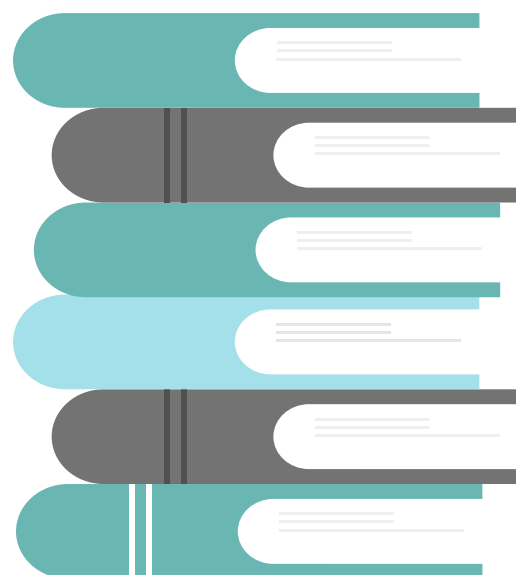

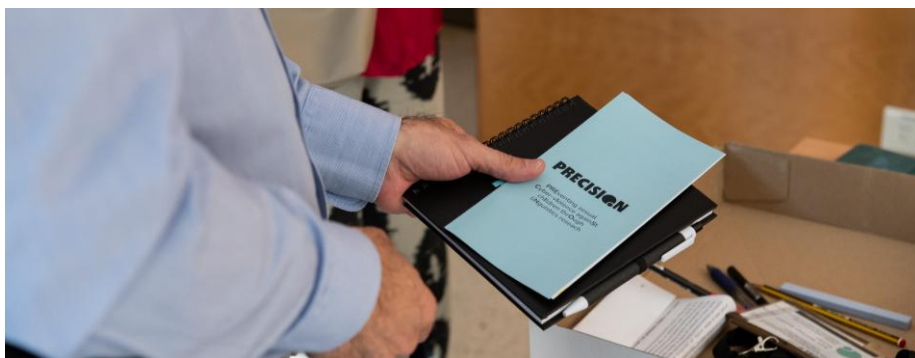
